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Project start and 1st Transnational Project Meeting. 29th and 30th October 2019, Valencia, Spain

Fit4Blue - Fishing Tourism for Blue Economy is an Erasmus+ project led by Petra Patrimonia Corsica in association with other partners from Spain (SGS and FUNDAMAR), Italy (MARE Società Cooperativa a.r.l. and Haliéus) and Greece (IDEC S.A.) who aims to grow entrepreneurship in the field of fisheries & aquaculture as well as to enhance youth participation in the Blue Economy.

The first transnational project meeting was held in Valencia (Spain) on 29th and 30th October 2019. All partners attended this first meeting where PPC, as lead partner, presented the project, target groups, objectives, expected results, indicators, partners' role, time-plan and activities. The second day, partners were welcomed by the Fisherman's Guild in the Port of Valencia.

Objectives

- ④ to develop **one benchmarking / state-of-art study**.
- ④ to develop **one e-course for trainers/mentors** to support fishermen diversifying their activities and preserving cultural heritage and coastal "know-how".
- ④ to develop **one e-course for low-skilled/low-qualified fishermen** (young/adults/workers) proposing new and innovative entrepreneurship educational paths in the Blue Economy.
- ④ to develop **one training e-platform** through which users can benefit from learning in an autonomous way.
